Major Changes

- Syria has been deep into a civil war since March 2011. The figures in the following tables represent the Syrian ORBAT before the outbreak of the civil war.
- Some tens of thousands Syrian soldiers defected, many of them joining the Free Syria Army. As of January 2013 the Syrian armed forces seem to be still active and loyal, but large parts of the country are probably no longer under the Assad regime's control.
- Concerns that the regime would use its chemical weapons have not materialized so far, but the regime did resort to firing Scud B missiles at the rebels' positions.
